

ILE GOLF COMMITTEE MEETING

4-14-09 3:00 P.M.

Members in attendance were: Norm Leslie, Pat Landy, Jane Barton, Richard Hoelzel, Gerrit Vonderheyde, George Miller, Anita Whitesell.

Also in attendance were: Archie Meyers, Rick Robinson, Mike Beard and Janice Massoti.

Minutes of previous meeting were read, adjusted and approved.

Pat Landy suggested the minutes of our committee meetings be put on the ILE website for all interested to see. It was discussed. A motion was made by Anita Whitesell seconded by George Miller and approved.

Mike Beard reported on the greens. Night temperatures are still below averages for this time of the year. The Fairway aerifying will be delayed until the first week in May. The plugs will be used to plug greens where necessary. Eight of the eleven soil samples were good. Sodium levels were high but the rains will take care of that. We need to increase the PH and Dolomite has been approved to be spread on the fairways and driving range on April 23rd. Nematode counts were very high. Nematicide has been applied.

The back nine was discussed. Aeration with plugs being used to fill in bare spots can be done more than once with a few weeks between. Sprigs could also be used. Plugs grow faster than sprigs. Rick questioned whether plugs could be gathered from other courses, Mike will make a few call to see if that would be possible.

Pat Landy made a motion that the back nine be kept closed until Mike is satisfied that it is ready for play. It was discussed and time for proper repair is important. Motion was seconded by Anita Whitesell and approved.

The Fee for Nine Holes will be \$10 for the summer. After 3:00 pm. 18 Holes will be \$10 and Nine Holes will be \$5. A motion was made by Pat Landy to close the proshop at 3:00 pm for the summer starting 4/24/09. Discussed and seconded by Anita Whitesell. Motion approved. A drop box is in place with forms and envelopes for payment of fees. Janice will change the ads to include after hours play.

The golf card maintenance will be performed in the afternoon April 23rd.

Our income is currently at 52% of yearly budget. Should be closer to 70%.

A Memorial Day Tournament (Saturday/Scramble) was mentioned and will be discussed further next meeting, first Tuesday in May.

Meeting adjourned at 5:00 pm.

DOLOMITE RAISES SOIL P.H., AND SULFUR LOWERS THE SOIL P.H. 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ TONS OF DOLOMITE HAS BEEN APPROVED TO BE SPREAD ON OUR FAIRWAYS AND DRIVING RANGE ON THUR. APRIL 23rd, WHEN THE COURSE IS SCHEDULED TO BE CLOSED TO AERIFY AND TOPDRESS THE GREENS.

IV. NEMATODE SAMPLES ARE ALSO ATTACHED.
THE STING NEMATODE COUNT IS STILL
CRITICALLY HIGH! ON FRI. AFTERNOON, APRIL 3rd
ALL OF THE GREENS WERE SPIKED AND THE GRANULAR
NEMATICIDE APPLIED AND IRRIGATED. THE GREENS
WERE NOT MOWED SAT, OR SUN., BECAUSE I DID
NOT WANT TO MOVE OR PICK-UP THE NEMATICIDE.

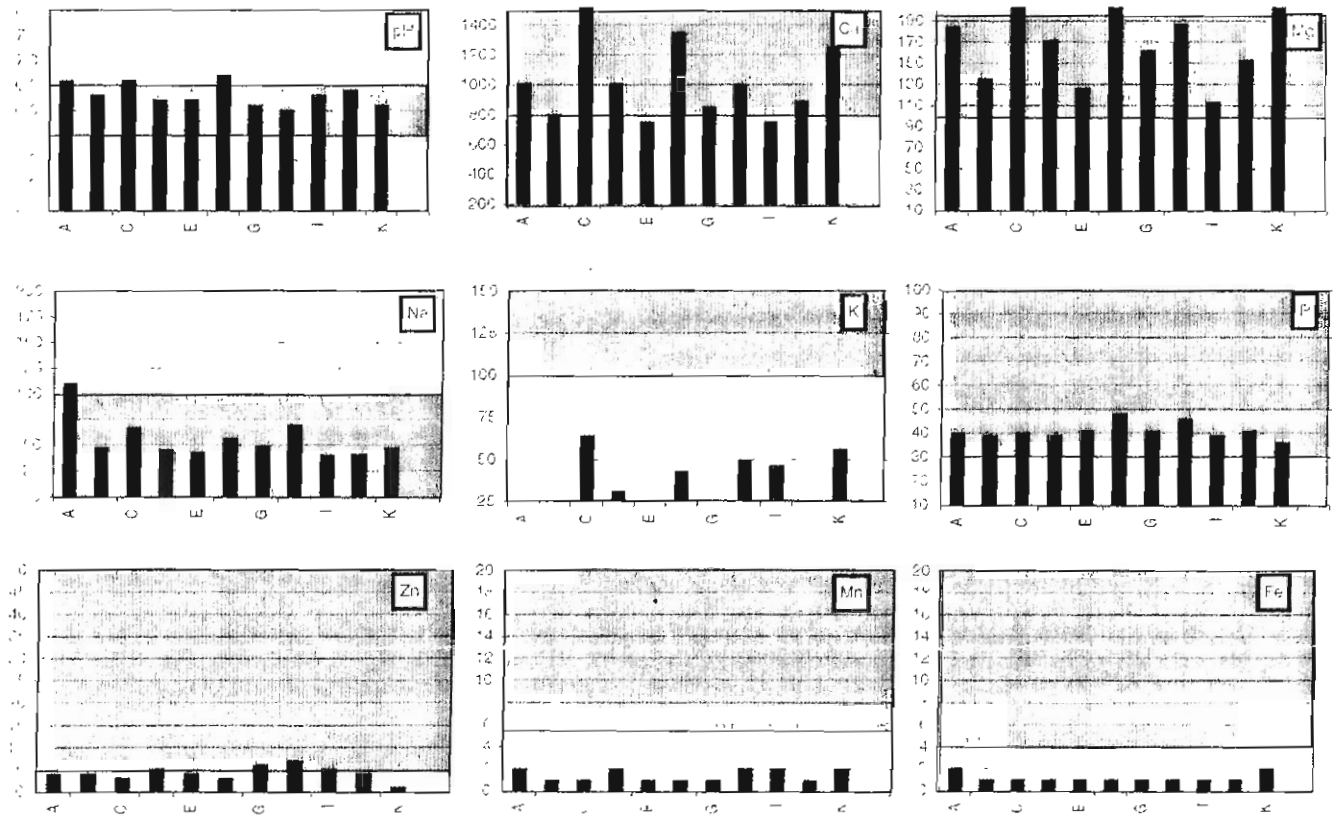
